Like anyone else, refugees and people seeking asylum need basis income support so they can pay their rent and feed their families - without income support individuals and families will become homeless and destitute.

I call on ministers and shadow ministers to urgently work together to ensure that refugees and people seeking asylum are provided with:

- Jobseeker and Jobkeeper payments, and payments for those unfit for work
- Medicare and telehealth services
- Access to family support services
- Access to free child care

Please act decisively to ensure that these most vulnerable people and families have access to basic income and the support services they need.

Encourage them to use their influence in the national COVID-19 cabinet. The states have an interest in persuading the federal government to provide income support for refugees and people seeking asylum – state governments should not be expected to fill the gap (though Victoria and Queensland did provide some funds in 2019). Social security and income support is a federal responsibility.

Background Information

- Given their temporary and insecure visa status, few people on Temporary, SHEV or Bridging Visas are able to find secure work in the current COVID-10 crisis it is likely that those who did have casual work or part-time work are now unemployed.
- Refugees and people seeking asylum are not currently included in the income support arrangements that have been put in place as a COVID-19 crisis response.
- Without income support people cannot pay their rent or feed their families and must rely on charity and the goodwill of Australians for rent, food and healthcare to survive.
- Charity organisations and local community groups will be overwhelmed in the coming weeks and months due to COVID-19 economic and health impacts.

The Federal Government has responded to the COVID-10 economic crisis by providing income support for people who have no income - refugees and people seeking asylum must be included.

This is very important - we must make every effort to ensure that all refugees and people seeking asylum have income support.
