PALM /SUNDAY in ARARAT (Vic)

The Palm Sunday gathering in Great Western (Vic) on Sunday 29 March was held near the Justice Sculpture. About 40 people attended and heard local people speak about how our community has extended a warm welcome to people from refugee backgrounds:

The first guest speaker was a representative from the Stawell Uniting Church who spoke of what Palm Sunday marches have come to mean across Australia, and the link of today's refugees to the story of Jesus being a refugee when Mary and Joseph had to flee from Bethlehem.

A local Karen woman who works and lives in our town gave us an insight into her childhood in a camp on the Thai/Burma border and how being accepted into Australia has changed her life. She now has hopes and dreams for her future - in the camp there were no dreams or possibilities.

From South Sudan to Australia is a big journey, especially when you don't even know where Australia is! This was the experience of our next speaker who has lived here for the past 29 years. She talked about the freedom and

prospects that Australia offers. She has raised her six children here and has become a valued and respected worker in the disability industry.

Our final speakers were the daughters of a couple who fled the horrors of South Sudan to seek a more peaceful and better life. They talked about the bravery of their parents and how their decision to come to Australia has meant they have so many opportunities to follow their dreams, pursue their sporting endeavours and make the most of their education.

After listening to the speakers, those present walked around the boundary of the park, following our RAR banner.

Coffee, cake, conversation and laughter at a cafe down the road was a lovely end to a very successful Palm Sunday gathering.



BENDIGO

Bendigo RAR, with support from Bendigo churches, and the Bendigo Amnesty and Grandmothers for refugee groups, gathered at Lake Weeroona on the Saturday evening ahead of Palm Sunday. It was a modest gathering, with participants appreciating the opportunity to gather to share their support for refugees. People walked in small groups around the lake, bearing signs that called for justice and welcome for refugees, and a brief vigil took place as the sun slowly disappeared.



BRISBANE

In Brisbane the Palm Sunday rally 2026. Called for: No war on Iran, Lebanon, Palestine and Cuba. No US alliance. Close US bases in Australia and close down the AUKUS military alliance. Close Nauru, no more deportations. End the racist visa restrictions on Iranian.



MELBOURNE



Around 500 people from many faith communities, unions and community groups attended. The Walk from Princes Bridge was led by drummers and dancers from the Congolese community and Cr Nick Reece, Lord Mayor of Melbourne who opened the program with a passionate endorsement of stronger together message and a celebration of Melbourne's diverse communities.

Other speakers included Alice Pung, writer and educator, Sr Brigid Arthur interviewed Gipson from West Papua, Rathy Barthole, a leader in the Tamil community, and Rasha Abbas spoke about the Palestinian refugees supported by PARA ([Palestine Australia Relief and Action](#)). Students from Xavier and Sacred Heart Girls' College performed a narrated movement piece calling us to show kindness and care for

others. Anglican Bishop Philip Huggins and Mohamed Mohideen, President of the Islamic Council of Victoria demonstrated the power of friendship and respect across different faith traditions. The lively music by Riff Raff Band, Ethiopian musician Eldakatur, Samer and Raed and the West Papuan Choir was enjoyed by all.
